On this three-page document, you will find a Learning Menu. Each child is encouraged to complete one activity under each category (reading, math, science & social studies, writing, and specials) each day. For example, if we are out of school for three days, your student will complete 15 activities. For each activity that the student completes, please initial in the corresponding box on the menu. The Learning Menu and any written work should be returned to the classroom teacher upon returning to school. Not all assignments will have written work to return.

Read for 20 minutes in a fun or unusual place in your home. Remember to be safe!	Write 4 numbers with 3 digits (EX: 543). Have students write a number 10 more and 10 less than the number and 100 more and 100 less than the number.	Look outside and make a list about what you see and hear.	Who is your favorite character in a movie or book? Why? Explain, using 4 complete sentences.	Move for 15 minutes. Turn on music and dance.
Read a story and draw a picture of what happened in the beginning, middle and end.	Create 2 word problems that involve adding or subtracting and solve the problems.	Go on a nature walk with an adult and discuss plants, insects, and animals you see.	Write a letter to one of your friends, planning some fun games you would play together during recess.	Draw a picture or create something artistic with items from around your house.
Log into IStation and complete reading activities for 30 minutes.	Find 5 angles and tell a parent or guardian if they are greater or less than a right angle.	Choose a nonfiction book on the Istation Library, read and describe your favorite parts to someone.	Write 5 complete sentences about what you did yesterday.	Help clean your bedroom or another part of your house.
Read a book out loud to a stuffed animal, doll, or pet. After reading, retell the story in your own words to your reading buddy.	Create an original schedule for a perfect day. Draw clocks to show the times for each event.	Think about your community and how all people can play an important role in it. Make a list of some of the important people in your community.	If you could switch places with your teacher for a day, what would you teach the class? Write your answer in 3 complete sentences.	Play a game (card, puzzle, board, etc.)
Read something other than a book (magazine, cereal box, newspaper, instruction manual, cookbook, etc.) Write down or tell someone 3 facts you learned.	Log into IStation and complete math activities for 30 minutes.	Go outside and see if it is a windy day. Discuss with an adult how you think the wind might change the way it looks outside.	What was the best thing that happened today? What was the worst thing? Answer in 4 complete sentences.	Play outside. Remember to be safe!
Read a book and write your own 5 question quiz.	Count the value of a handful of coins. Repeat with a different set of coins.	Draw a detailed map of a room in your house and share it with someone.	Imagine you are an insect. Write a story about what your life would be like.	Design a musical rhythm or sing a song.
